5. Social Action Projects

As you start engaging deeply with topics of interest and exploring the world around you, it's natural to want to 'make a difference' by undertaking social action projects.

Social Action Projects are a great way to support your local community, advocate for change, solve a problem, or raise money. You might want to tackle such programs as a group, or on your own.

By doing Social Action Projects, you demonstrate your ability to understand multiple perspectives, to take ethical action, and to develop your skills in problem-solving, collaboration and global citizenship, which are attributes that are highly valued by employers and further education institutions.

Here are some examples that previous students have done:

- Organising 'School students against climate change' protests
- Curating an art exhibition for artists with a disability
- Working with aged-care residents to write their life stories
- Participating in family/religious community fundraisers for refugees
- Cleaning up a local waterway
- Producing a short film about the problems with single-use plastics
- Taking part in on-country ranger programs to protect the local environment from pest and weed infestations
- Raising money to support the care of injured wildlife in the wake of bushfires.


Reflections during the process could include:
